## Fruit and Nut tree varieties for the 2021 season

*Revised 10/14/2020*

Bayview Farm and Garden offers a broad range of fruit and nut trees for the home garden or orchard. Availability is limited and subject to change at any time.

*All fruit and nut trees will be healthiest and produce best in full sun and with regular water.* Well maintained and properly sited fruit and nut trees perform better with fewer disease and pest problems. Bayview recommends using **EB Stone Organics Sure Start** in combination with **EB Stone Organics Planting Compost** at planting time, followed up with **EB Stone Organics Citrus & Fruit Tree Food**.

### **APPLES:**

Apple trees need to be pollinated by almost any other variety planted nearby. Gravenstein, Red Gravenstein and King are not pollinators and will require a third tree. Combo trees have multiple pollinizers grafted on one tree and are fine as solitary trees.

**Approximate mature height: Semi-Dwarf (M-106) 10-15', Dwarf (M-26) 8-10'.** Mature height may vary with each variety.

- **4-Way Combo (5 varieties)** Spartan, Honeycrisp, Chehalis, Akane, Liberty. Semi Dwarf (BR)(C).
- **Espalier Combo 3 tier** Akane, Honeycrisp, Liberty. Dwarf (BR)(C).
- **Akane** Red 'lunch box' type. Dessert quality. Good scab and mildew resistance. Late Aug to Sept. Semi-Dwarf (BR)(C); Dwarf (BR).
- **Beni Shogun Fuji** Crisp juicy red apple ripens 1 month earlier than Fuji. September. Semi-Dwarf (BR)(C).
- **Braeburn** Medium size, golden red. Excellent flavor, matures late, keeps well. Semi-dwarf (BR).
- **Bramley** Green/yellow. Scab and mildew resistant. Good cooking apple can be eaten fresh. Early October. Semi-Dwarf (BR).
- **Cosmic Crisp** Amazing red juicy apple perfect sweetness and tartness and great for storing as well. Excellent eating apple. Honeycrisp x Enterprise. Scab resistant. September. Semi-Dwarf (BR)(C); Dwarf (BR)(C).
- **Enterprise** Dark red. Vigorous and productive Considered immune to scab. Good mildew resistance. October. Semi-Dwarf (BR)(C).
- **Granny Smith** Large, late, green, all-purpose. Crisp, tart, excellent keeper. Good pollinizer. Semi-Dwarf (BR).

- **Gravenstein** The classic. Red stripes on yellow. Firm, crisp and juicy. Great for cider and pies. September. Semi-Dwarf (C).
- **Honeycrisp** Big all-purpose red apple that is crisp and juicy. Sept-Oct. Semi-Dwarf (BR)(C); Dwarf (BR)(C).
- **King** Large yellow with red striping. Good for eating fresh, cooking or storing. October Semi-Dwarf (BR)(C).
- **Liberty** Red, crisp and juicy. Excellent disease resistance. October. Semi-Dwarf (BR)(C); Dwarf (BR)(C).
- **Pink Lady (Maslin)** Earlier variety of the popular Pink Lady. Large, crisp, sweet tart. Pink blush, yellow skin. September. Semi-dwarf (BR)(C).
- **Red Gravenstein** Large, red, firm flesh. Late September. Semi-dwarf (BR)
- **Spartan** Dark red, crisp, excellent flavor with good storage. Heavy bearing. Late September. Excellent disease resistance. Semi-dwarf (BR).
- **Yellow Transparent** Medium large, yellow tender, tart good cooking. Early August. Good disease resistance. Semi-dwarf (BR).
- **Dolgo Crabapple** 1.5-inch crimson fruit (crabs). High disease resistance and great pollinator for most apples. Semi-dwarf (BR).
- **Evereste Crabapple.** Pretty ornamental with 1 inch edible red crabapples. Excellent pollinator for other apples and superb disease resistance.

## PEARS and QUINCE

Like Apples, Pears need a pollinator tree of a different variety planted nearby. Any two varieties on our list will pollinate each other. Quince are self-fertile. Combo trees have multiple pollinizers grafted on one tree and are fine as solitary trees.

**Approximate mature height: Semi-Dwarf (OHxF 97) 14-18', Dwarf (OHxF 87) 12-16'.**

Mature height may vary with each variety. Asian pears tend to stay smaller.

- **4-way Combo European (6 varieties)** Bartlett, Flemish Beauty, Red Bartlett, Rescue, Anjou, Bosc Dwarf (on quince) (BR)(C).
- **Espalier Combo 3 tier European** Bartlett, Bosc, Red Clapps. Dwarf (on quince) (BR)(C)
- **Bartlett European** Medium-large Very sweet, tender. Excellent eating and canning. Early Sept. Semi-Dwarf. (BR)(C).
- **Kosui Asian** Medium large, yellow russeted, tender, sweet, spicy, aromatic. September. Semi-Dwarf. (BR)
- **Nijisseiki (20<sup>th</sup> Century) Asian** Medium round, greenish yellow, crisp and juicy, keeps well. August. Semi-Dwarf. (C)
- **Shinseiki Asian** Medium round, yellow, crisp, and juicy. Semi-dwarf. (BR)(C).
- **Orcas European** Yellow blushed, large sweet and flavorful, good for canning or eating fresh, excellent scab resistance, September. Semi-Dwarf (BR)(C); Dwarf (BR).

- **Red Bartlett European** Like Bartlett except bright red and sweeter. Semi-dwarf. (BR)(C).
- **Rescue European** Yellow blushed, very productive and scab resistant, juicy and sweet. Late August. Semi-Dwarf (C); Dwarf (BR)(C).
- **Orange Quince** Large yellow fruit with orange tinted flesh. Turns red when cooked. Semi-dwarf. (C).
- **Pineapple Quince** Medium sized yellow pear shaped. Pineapple flavor. Large white flowers. Semi-dwarf. (BR).

## CHERRIES:

While some Cherry varieties require a pollinator of another Cherry variety, others are self-fertile (indicated below) and can produce plentifully on their own. Self-fertile varieties will produce even more with another variety planted nearby. Combo trees have multiple pollinizers grafted on one tree and are fine as solitary trees.

**Approximate mature height: Semi-Dwarf (Mazzard F 12-1) 22-29'; Dwarf (Gisela 5) 12-15'.** Mature height may vary with each variety.

- **4-way Combo (6 varieties)** Bing, Rainier, Stella, Glacier, Van, Royal Anne. Dwarf. (BR).
- **Angela** large, black, crack and disease resistant. July. Dwarf. (BR).
- **Bing** Top quality, large juicy and sweet black cherry. July. Dwarf (BR)(C).
- **Lapins** Dark, high quality similar to Bing with better disease and crack resistance, **self-fertile**. June. Dwarf. (BR)(C)
- **Montmorency** Pie cherry. Bright red, soft, juicy, sweet tart. **Self-fertile**. July. Dwarf. (BR)(C).
- **Rainier** Well known Yellow with pink blush, sweet and productive. Late June-early July. Dwarf. (BR)(C)
- **Stella** Red-black, plump and juicy, disease and crack resistant, productive and **self-fertile**. June. Dwarf. (BR)(C).
- **Sweetheart** Bright red sweet cherry. Late July. **Self-fertile**. Dwarf. (C).

## PLUMS:

Like their Cherry relatives, Plums are variable. The Asian Plums (large and round) should be planted with another Asian variety as a pollinator. European Plums (smaller and oval: often dried to make prunes) are generally self-fertile but will produce more heavily with another European variety nearby.

**Approximate mature height: Semi-Dwarf (Marianna 2624) 15-18'.** Mature height may vary with each variety. All our Plums are semi-dwarf.

- **Beauty Asian** red with amber tinged red flesh, juicy and amazing rich flavor, ripens in August. (BR)(C)

- **Brooks European Plum/Prune** dark purple with very sweet yellow flesh, great for eating fresh or making preserves, drying and canning. August (BR)(C)
- **Green Gage European** Oval greenish yellow with amber flesh. Sweet good flavor all purpose. August. (BR)(C).
- **Italian European Plum/Prune** the classic. Medium purplish black, sweet, Great fresh, canned or dried. Late August. (BR)(C). Dwarf. (BR).
- **Methley European** Reddish purple with sweet red flesh. Early August. (C).
- **Shiro Asian** Large round, golden yellow with yellow flesh. Sweet and very juicy. Partially self-fertile. August. (BR)(C).
- **Yellow Egg European** Large oval, bright yellow with yellow flesh. Good for fresh eating or canning. August. (BR)(C)

### **PEACHES, NECTARINES and APRICOTS:**

Also related to Cherries and Plums, Peaches, Apricots and Nectarines are self-fertile. Diseases can be a problem in our area. We carry only varieties known to be disease resistant.

**Approximate mature height: Semi-Dwarf (Marianna 2624) 15-18'. Dwarf (St. Julien A) 12-15'.** Mature height may vary with each variety.

- **Frost Peach** Leaf curl resistant. Yellow flesh, freestone. August. Semi-Dwarf (BR)(C). Dwarf (BR).
- **Hardy Red (Hardired) Nectarine** New for NW gardens! Red with gold blush with yellow flesh, very disease resistant, excellent flavor, semi-freestone, August. Semi-Dwarf (BR)(C)
- **Puget Gold Apricot** Medium sized, firm, and sweet. August. Semi-dwarf (BR)
- **Salish Summer (Q-18) Peach** This new variety is one of the most reliable for the Pacific Northwest. Leaf curl resistant, white flesh, sweet, juicy and flavorful, semi-freestone. (BR)

### **NUTS:**

Nut trees demand full sun in well drained locations. Nuts ripen in fall.

- **Jefferson Filbert (Hazelnut)** Grows to about 12'. A newer blight immune variety. Large, uniform nuts. Good producer. Plant with Theta as a pollinator. (C).
- **Theta Filbert (Hazelnut)** Grows to about 12'. Features very flavorful, medium-size nuts and immune to Filbert Blight. Plant with Jefferson as a pollinator (C).
- **Cascade English Walnut** Fast growing large tree (30-50') Thin shell, excellent flavor. Somewhat self-fertile. (C).

### **SPECIALTY:**

This year we are offering something special!

- **Fruit Cocktail** Frost Peach, Puget Gold Apricot, Hardy Red Nectarine, Sweetheart Cherry, Italian Prune, Lapin Cherry. ALL ON ONE TREE! Dwarf. (BR).
